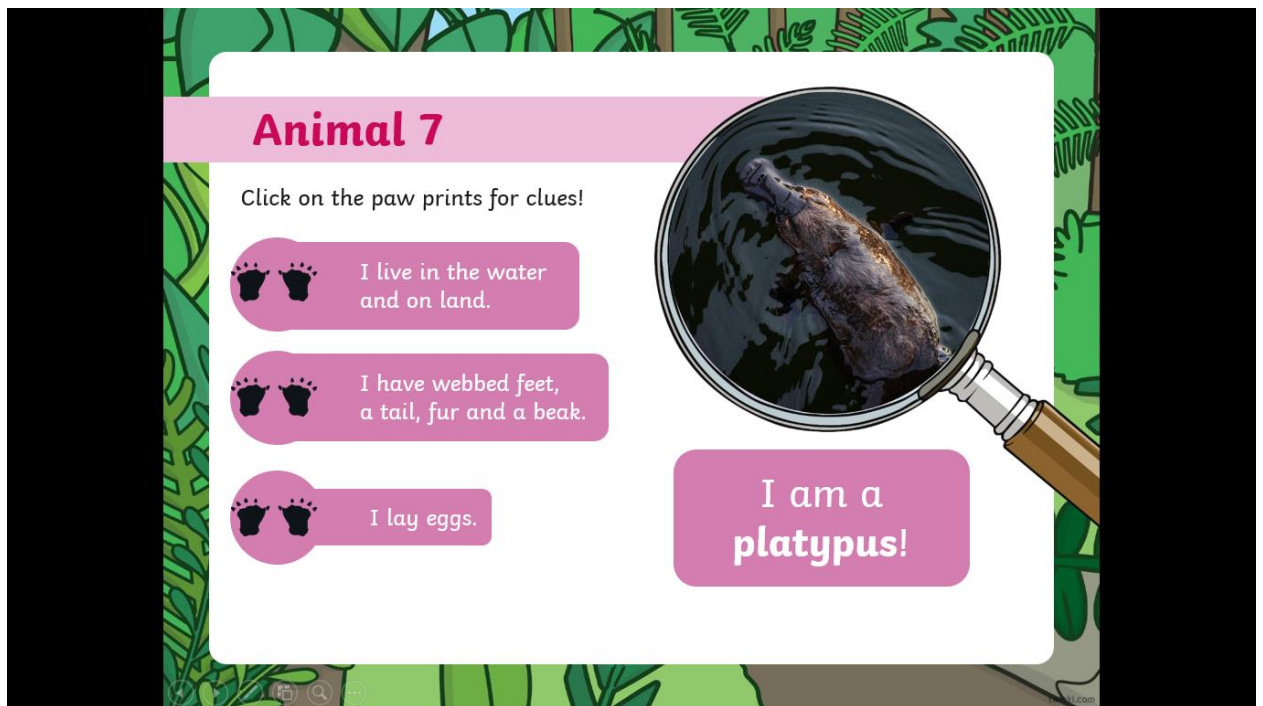

4 - Here are the logic questions about Australian animals translated into English:

Logic Questions about Australian Animals

1. **Question:** Australia is home to several species of kangaroos. If one kangaroo can jump 3 meters high and another can jump 1.5 meters high, how many meters can both kangaroos jump in total if they do so at the same time?

- a) 4.5 meters
- b) 5.5 meters
- c) 6 meters
- d) 3 meters

2. **Question:** If a koala sleeps up to 22 hours a day and spends the rest of its time eating eucalyptus leaves, how many hours does a koala have left for activity each day?

- a) 1 hour
- b) 6 hours
- c) 3 hours
- d) 2 hours

3. **Question:** Australian dolphins are known for their playfulness. If 5 dolphins play with a ball and each dolphin throws the ball 4 times, how many times will the ball be thrown in total?

- a) 15 times
- b) 20 times
- c) 25 times
- d) 30 times

4. **Question:** Crocodiles can stay underwater for up to 2 hours. If they swim away for 1 hour but return after 15 minutes, how much time can they remain on the surface if they still have the option to stay underwater for another 30 minutes?

- a) 1 hour and 15 minutes
- b) 30 minutes
- c) 45 minutes
- d) 2 hours

5. **Question:** Birds of paradise, known for their bright plumage, can take up to 100 steps per minute. If one bird takes 1500 steps in 15 minutes, how many steps will it take in 1 hour?

- a) 6000 steps
- b) 9000 steps
- c) 18000 steps
- d) 12000 steps

Question: If one kangaroo can jump 3 meters high and another can jump 1.5 meters high, how many meters can both kangaroos jump in total if they do so at the same time?

Answer: c) 6 meters (3 + 1.5 = 4.5 meters, which is their individual height, but total height is not combined; it's a trick question.)

Question: If a koala sleeps up to 22 hours a day and spends the rest of its time eating eucalyptus leaves, how many hours does a koala have left for activity each day?

Answer: a) 2 hours (24 hours - 22 hours = 2 hours)

Question: If 5 dolphins play with a ball and each dolphin throws the ball 4 times, how many times will the ball be thrown in total?

Answer: b) 20 times (5 dolphins \times 4 throws = 20 throws)

Question: If crocodiles can stay underwater for up to 2 hours, and they swim away for 1 hour but return after 15 minutes, how much time can they remain on the surface if they still have the option to stay underwater for another 30 minutes?

Answer: b) 30 minutes (They have already spent 1 hour, and they returned after 15 minutes to remain on the surface.)

Question: If birds of paradise can take up to 100 steps per minute, and one bird takes 1500 steps in 15 minutes, how many steps will it take in 1 hour?

Answer: b) 6000 steps (1500 steps in 15 minutes means 1500 steps / 15 minutes = 100 steps per minute, so in 60 minutes: 100 steps \times 60 minutes = 6000 steps)

Script: "A Trip to Australia"

Characters:

- **Sasha** — a curious girl
- **Yana** — her friend, an inspired traveler
- **Guide** — a local resident of Australia (can be played by one of the students)
- **Kangaroo** — a representative of Australian fauna
- **Koala** — another well-known Australian animal
- **Cockatoo** — a bright, eccentric bird

Scene 1: At the Airport

(Sasha and Yana are standing with their suitcases, preparing to board their flight to Australia.)

Sasha: (excitedly) Yana, are you ready for our adventure? Australia is waiting for us!

Yana: (smiling) Yes! I've dreamed of seeing kangaroos and koalas! This time, we'll be real explorers.

(Sound of an announcement for boarding.)

Voice over the speaker: Attention! Flight to Australia is ready for boarding. Please proceed to the boarding gate.

Sasha: (enthusiastically) Let's go, to new discoveries!

(They step forward, and the lights go out.)

Scene 2: In Australia

(On stage — a beach or tropical forest, with Australian music playing. The Guide enters the stage.)

Guide: (welcomingly) Welcome to Australia, friends! Here you will see incredible animals, beautiful beaches, and unique nature.

Sasha: (in awe) Wow! There's so much interesting stuff here!

Yana: (asking a question) Can we meet a kangaroo?

Guide: Of course! (points to the kangaroo entering the stage) Look, here comes a kangaroo!

(The Kangaroo hops in, portraying the animal.)

Kangaroo: (playfully) Hello! I'm a kangaroo! I'm a trickster. Do you want to see me jump?

Sasha: (excitedly) Yes, show us!

(The Kangaroo performs a few jumps.)

Scene 3: Meeting the Koala

(The Kangaroo exits, then the Koala comes on stage.)

Koala: (in a relaxed pose, slowly) Hi, guys! I'm a koala. I love sleeping in trees all day.

Yana: (laughing) Just like our cat!

****Koala:**** (playfully) Yes, I'm great at it! Eucalyptus leaves are my favorite food. If you were a koala, what would you do?

****Sasha:**** (thoughtfully) I would sleep all day!

Scene 4: Meeting the Cockatoo

(The Cockatoo, a colorful bird with beautiful feathers and a lively character, enters the stage.)

****Cockatoo:**** (enthusiastically) Hi, friends! I'm a cockatoo! I can mimic you and make different sounds. Want to hear?

****Yana:**** (excitedly) Yes, of course! Do something fun!

****Cockatoo:**** (starts making various sounds — playfully screeching "Cockatoo!" and imitating voices.) How do you like this?

(Sasha and Yana laugh.)

****Sasha:**** (laughing) Awesome! You're amazing!

Scene 5: Conclusion

(All characters gather on stage.)

****Guide:**** We met the wonders of Australia: kangaroos, koalas, and cockatoos. Did you enjoy your trip?

****Sasha:**** (enthusiastically) It was incredible! I learned a lot about the animals!

****Yana:**** (agreeing) Yes, me too! I hope we come back here again!

****Guide:**** Remember, Australia is always ready to welcome you, and there's so much more to explore!

(All characters raise their hands and say together.)

****All:**** Thank you, Australia!

(The lights slowly dim, and a banner appears on stage with the words "Australia - a different country where amazing animals live!")
